I conceded that from its beginning in 1964 the women in *Sports Illustrated* are breathtakingly beautiful. They complement the swimsuits they wear. I would be proud to be on the cover of *SI*. Who actually reads the Swimsuit issue of *Sports Illustrated*?

body. It's a safe bet that the back of this swimsuit leaves a modest sample of back to the viewer but completely covers the cheeks (no thongs or buns hanging out). This is the type of swimsuit I would wear, as I have much to hide. But this type of suit would be considered scandalous from where it all began.

It's a shame what women have had to put up with in terms of clothing over the centuries. The early swimsuit/bathing suit was no different. Women's clothing had to reflect not only the mores of society, but the new accessibility of beaches because of trains and the swimming activity itself. But, whatever she wore had to be modest and nonrevealing. It was said that women often used weights to prevent their dresses from floating up in the water and showing their legs. What about drowning?

Before then, in the early 1800's, beach wear included the

Seaside walking dress, a full length, to the ground gown, usually pink or white and, of course, with long sleeves with cuffs.

Queen Victoria's era brought the world the bathing machine. Believe it or not, this was a horsedrawn house where the occupant therein could change clothes, bathe in the shallow waters off the shore and return via the same method when her bath was finished.

The French, of course, were credited with being the first to bring swimsuits to the fashion world between 1890 and 1900. Early swimsuits were dark, usually black or blue. To break the austerity of lines, it was trimmed with white. The favorite fabrics for these garments were alpaca or flannel. (Could she really swim in those fabrics?) Of course, no part of the body could show, and there was the emphasis on keeping the skin as white as possible--unblemished by the sun--as a sign of purity. (Oops, that left out about 20 million of us!) Toward that goal, the neckline was kept high, the bodice was loosefitting, and her arms were covered by elbow-length leg-of-mutton sleeves. She wore bloomers beneath the skirt of her swimsuit and accessorized her ensemble with black stockings and laced-up bathing slippers made of serge or straw, Turkish towel or canvas shoes. Let us not forget the fancy caps that topped off the look.


The voluminous yards of material used to cover the woman's body began to dwindle in the early 20th century. Though they were still accompanied by long stockings, by 1910, the contours of a woman's body could be detected, and the sun was no longer something to avoid. Because women began to take up the actual sport of swimming, the heavy fabrics were dropped, and the knitted, onepiece swimming suit began to take its place. Portions of actual body were seen from the tops of the stockings

Villain Demands His Own Love Story in **Devil in Texas** by Adrienna deWolfe

No one was supposed to fall in love with him – least of all me. He was supposed to be the evil gunfighter, who gets ventilated by the hero. (In Western slang, the definition of ventilate is *"to fill a man full of bullet holes."* Great image, right?)

So there I sat, plotting the climax in my new historical romance, when my *very* mulish villain dug in his heels and said, "Whoa! You got me all wrong,



Wolfie. I'm not so bad. I'm funny! How many outlaws do you know with get-away horses named Pancake? And what about that time I broke the bed 'cause I was so ... uh ... *spirited* in the whorehouse? I'm too adorable for Boot Hill! I need a book and a woman of my own!" "Eros in Spurs," as the rascal is so aptly named, can be extremely persuasive. The next thing I knew, I was doing something crazy: rewriting the plot of a previously published romance so I could redeem William Cassidy and star him in his own series of romantic whodunits. *Devil in Texas* (Book 1, *Lady Law & The Gunslinger*,) reunites "Coyote Cass" with Sadie, a wise-cracking, pistol-packing Pinkerton Agent -- the one woman whom Cass has never been able to forget.

I think star-crossed lovers make the most interesting reads. Imagine how much pent-up emotion gets triggered when old flames reunite. I was striving for that intensity when Cass walks into a Galveston casino and comes face to face with the temptress who broke his heart. For her part, Sadie describes how desperately she struggled "to forget the searing heat of his kisses" when Cass galloped out of her life for the second time in their tumultuous history.

Turning a villain into a hero requires an author to walk a tight-rope: how much "bad" can the reader forgive? Cass turned vigilante at an early age because he wanted to "clean up Texas and make it a safe place for little kiddies to play." Sadie dubs him "Lucifire," because he's a devil with a gun – and he's hotter than a pitchfork under the sheets.


But if we're talking true confessions, then I have to admit, I was more worried about making readers love Sadie. Why? Well...let's just say she kicks butt. *A lot.* Like Cass, she has a checkered past. Becoming a Pinkerton was her way of fighting corruption on the frontier. I wrote her like a female action hero: daring, resourceful, and *funny*. The way my brain's wired, I just can't write books without humor. (So for all you suspense purists, I apologize in advance for Vandy the Raccoon.)

Sadie's sass is the perfect foil for Cass's "Coyote Charm." Their best lines drip with sexual innuendo, which makes their battle of wits so wickedly delicious.

AdC: When did you start writing and why?

JASA: My original goal was financial, but the process of writing quickly turned into a passion. When I approached the age of being a senior citizen, I thought of ways to supplement Social Security. My college major of English started me looking at writing as a second career. Little did I know how difficult it is to write a novel and how much I had to learn to be good at it!

My first four years were spent in online classes and rewriting *MATILDA'S SONG*. Then I got the hang of it and can generally write a novel in a year and a half. Online classes continue because I have a strong desire to improve my craft. Even if I never sell another book, I will continue writing because the creative adventure brings me great joy.

AdC: *What have you learned about writing since you started?*

JASA: I learned it takes a long time to get established as an author. We authors wish that all we had to do is write, but these days we have to

promote ourselves as well. It's a totally different skill set and it took me a while to get comfortable with "tooting my own horn"—a necessity in today's marketplace.

description, and more dialog (which means more white space around passages of text). Since I started writing at the advent of the Internet into everyday life, I've been able to adjust.

AdC: *Tell us about your new book or series.*

JASA: *Expect Deception* (Book 2 of the "Operation Delphi" series) released 6/21/16 from She Writes Press, Inc. In this series, five psychics (assigned to the U.S. Navy during WWII) hunt Nazi spies.

The hero is the skeptical naval commander in charge of setting up the project. The heroine is the clairvoyant U.S. WAVE assigned to oversee the administrative aspects of the top secret facility and lead the psychic team. Each psychic has a unique skill to bring to the mix (clairvoyant, medium, crystal ball reader, laying-on-of-hands healer, and seer of ghosts). In the first book of the series, they get to know one another enough to watch the other's "psychic" back.

The newly released second book brings in a spy skilled in black magic, who can invoke demons. The Navy's team of psychics must reach beyond their individual skills and unite as a group to have enough powers to fight back.

AdC: *What can we expect from you next?*

JASA: In Book 3, *Expect Betrayal* (currently being written), the hero and heroine travel to war-torn London to retrieve a book of counter spells smuggled out of Nazi-controlled

Bavaria by the heroine's family. What they don't know is that an assassin is shadowing their steps and has orders to kill them and take the book to Hitler.

AdC: *What is your idea of a perfect day?*

JASA: When the writing flows and the research concludes quickly and easily.

AdC: Do you have any hobbies?

JASA: I like to exercise with friends in the city's indoor swimming pool.


AdC: *What authors do you admire?* JASA: I love Jim Butcher's ability to bring touches of the ordinary world skillfully into his extraordinary story worlds. My writing is the opposite. I write an ordinary world and bring in

you will be filling 300 of them and you're not sure exactly how you'll do that.


AdC: *The best thing?* JASA: When the words flow and the ideas click.


AdC: *What do you expect to be doing 10 years from now?* JASA: Writing more stories in the WWII paranormal suspense series.

The most revolutionary changes in the swimsuit came in 1947 and 1948, introduced by the French. Under their design, the swimsuit became the most abbreviated, consisting of two parts; a G-string and a bra. Naturally, this was not quite acceptable to the Americans, and we added a few more inches to the French Bikini while holding onto the once piece--with alterations. Those variations took the form of low back, loss of bra straps, and bare midriffs. The bikini over time lost a lot of its bottom, giving way to thongs.

When one thinks of the changes from the 1910 swimsuit to what we currently see on the beach and

at poolside, we are amazed. When one considers that it seems to be irrelevant what kind of body is stuffed into some of the swimsuits, that modesty has fallen by the wayside, some are appalled. But not me. I know how I look in a bikini, and that's why the swimsuit on the cover is for me. What's your style?

Debra Parmley's Cover Model Corner--Chase Borst

I'm excited to be interviewing Chase Borst on Cover Model Corner today. I met Chase in May at the Weekend with the Authors in Nashville, Tennessee, this year, and he graciously agreed to an interview.

DP: *Chase, what was the first cover you appeared on and how did this come about?*

CB: My first cover was *Roping Him In* by Sidda Lee Rain.

Michel Prince is an author and owner of Royal Touch Photography. She worked out at the gym that I worked



at a few years back. She approached me one day and asked if I would be interested in doing a photoshoot with her for images that could potentially be used as book covers. I agreed and things just progressed from there. I honestly had no clue what I was getting myself into or what the outcome would be, but I have met a lot of really cool people and had some pretty awesome experiences since I started.

DP: If you could do a photo shoot anywhere in the world for a cover, where would you most want to go? What sort of shoot would it be?

CB: Somewhere tropical for sure. I would really love to go to Kenya. The beaches look amazing. I think I would like to do a romantic shoot with my significant other. Besides their beaches, the inland backdrop of Kenya is cool, too. I would probably want to do daytime photos with both backdrops, hoping for some giraffes or elephants in the shot. And, of course, some sunset photos inland, as well as on the beach.

DP: *Ah, there is nothing quite like a beach anywhere in the world, especially at sunset. Giraffes and elephants; now that would be fun. Beyond romance novel cover shots, what other projects or jobs keep you busy?*

CB: My girlfriend and I recently started a meal prep business, Core Meals. We heard from so many people that nutrition is their biggest struggle for a number of reasons, so we provide them a very affordable, convenient way to eat healthy. I also spend a lot of time reading and learning about health and wellness.

DP: *If you wrote a book, what would it be about?*

CB: I would probably tell a story about a person with a very troubled childhood and overcoming their obstacles and hardships. The book would be a timeline of their life and how they reacted to and overcame the struggles.

DP: *That is a story I would read or would love to hear one day.*

DP: *This question is almost always asked in interviews because your fitness level is beyond the average persons.*





What is your exercise routine and what sort of nutrition plan do you follow to achieve and maintain your level of fitness? **CB:** My fitness routine consists of heavy resistance training 5-7 days per week, sometimes twice a day. Honestly, I don't really follow a plan. I generally rotate body parts in a 4 day split, and try to push myself while at the gym. I generally do not do cardio unless I'm in show prep and even then it's minimal. My diet in show prep restricts the types of foods I eat, my caloric intake, cycle my macros according to my training. When I'm not in prep I like to eat a wide variety of healthy foods, I'm a good cook and I enjoy it, so I get to be a little more creative with my meals. I generally do not track macros or calories but keep things pretty clean overall. I do like treats, though, and definitely eat them in moderation when I am not preparing for a competition.

DP: If you could share three simple fitness tips the average romance reader could do every day to stay healthy, what would they be?

CB: 1. Nutrition comes before fitness and should be top priority. If you aren't eating right, you are just spinning your wheels in the gym. I highly recommend an app to log your daily intake, and log EVERYTHING you eat. (I like my fitness pal.) A lot of people are in denial about what they put into their bodies.

 In the gym, primarily focus on strength training while supplementing cardio. Too many people think cardio is the answer for weight loss or to achieve their desired physique. Cardio is necessary, but in the right amount. Too much cardio can have the opposite effect that most people desire. The after effects of resistance training boost the metabolism for much longer than cardio and the muscle acquired from weight training also increases your body's ability to burn calories while at rest.
 Challenge yourself and push your limits. You would be really surprised by what you are capable of. Most people sell themselves short in the gym and set limits in their head as far as how much weight they can handle, especially women. Lifting heavy does wonders for the female body. If it doesn't challenge you, it doesn't change you.

DP: Thank you for that excellent advice. Nutrition is so important. It's important to eat healthy. Sometimes it's fine to cheat though. It's your birthday dinner and the calories don't count. What's on the menu and what are you drinking? **CB:** It was my birthday a few days ago...I enjoyed sushi, steak, ahi tuna and a grilled pineapple mojito served with a sparkler in it.

DP: Well happy belated birthday! What a fun menu!

DP: Describe the perfect romantic evening.


CB: I would pick her up and we would go to Willow River State Park and hike down to the waterfalls, hand in hand, while having an intimate conversation. We

would hike around in the serenity of sounds and beauty of the constant flow of water, watching every one of her movements. At some point, take a moment to sit in silence on one of the many rocks while taking each other in. Then we would hike up to the top of an overlook with an amazing view of the natural beauty of the park, talking about life, with her in my arms, kissing her neck

and shoulders. From there we would head back home and enjoy a candlelit dinner. Afterward, we would cuddle up on the couch and watch *The Notebook*, paying more attention to her than the movie. Talking silently to her with my hands. When the moment was just right, I would kiss her and then carry her up the stairs...

DP: Please share one unusual fact about you or your life:

CB: I was homeless at one point in my life.

DP: I'm so glad you're not homeless now. What an inspiration you can be to others!



Rachel lives near the famous city of Bath, England, with her husband of 18 years, their two teenage daughters and chocolate Labrador, Tyler. She writes mainstream romance and romantic suspense for Harlequin Superromance & Victorian romance for eKensington/Lyrical Press.



AdC: When did you start writing and why?

R.B. I started writing short stories in 2001 and novels in 2006 – The Wild Rose Press published my first book, *Searching For Sophie*, in 2007 and I've had at least one book published each year since. I started writing because it was always a dream of mine to be a published novelist and I had a 'now or never' moment!

AdC: What have you learned about writing since you started?

R.B. That it's hard work! I have nearly finished my nineteenth novel and it never gets any easier. A lot of hours go into writing a book, plus there is editing and endless promotion. It truly is a full-time job.

AdC: Tell us about your new book or series.

R.B. My latest book is Book 6 in my "Harlequin Templeton Cove" series. *Saved by The Firefighter* is a contemporary romance dealing with overcoming grief and trusting someone else to take care of you. I loved writing this book!

AdC: What is your idea of a perfect day?

R.B. A full day's uninterrupted writing, followed by a delicious dinner of my husband's amazing fish pie and a glass or two of chilled white wine. Bliss!

AdC: Do you have any hobbies?

R.B. I'm an avid knitter. I love it and find it a huge stress reliever. I'm never happier than sitting in front of the TV with my knitting. Haha!

AdC: What authors do you admire?

R.B. So many, but my favorites are Nora Roberts, Jill Shalvis & Philippa Gregory.

AdC: What is the worst thing about being an author?

R.B. The time spent promoting rather than writing! It is so necessary to promote your work as publishers are doing less and less. It can be hugely time consuming but, hopefully, it pays off in the end.

AdC: *The best thing?*

R.B. I think I have the best job in the world – to be able to spend all day making up characters and stories is a dream come true. I love nothing more than when a reader or reviewer tells me how much they love my books and why.







Sean had been two-timed by women one time too many. After throwing out his fiancée when he came home early and found her in bed with another man, Sean needed an outlet for his rage. So he signed onto a chat room under the moniker of Angry White Man and ranted and raved about the female gender. He would either get agreements (from the men) or outrage from the women until he started chatting with Sweet Thang, who challenged his outlook and opinions on so many levels that he was totally intrigued. I have to admit that, as an African-American woman, I found the title of this book totally off-putting. 



Wicked Angel Author Julia London Narrated by Anne Flosnik Brilliance Audio CD 978-1491507445 ****

Both bodies had a strange tattoo--a pole with something wrapped around it and a drawing of a comet falling to earth. Later she would find some text that identified it as the "falling star that slew summer." This was an asteroid that caused a perpetual winter on Earth in 536 A.D. And then there was this belt with strange markings on it.

The riddle was that the tattoo could be used to decode the figures on the belt that would show the location of the asteroid. If one found that location, the key to a miracle drug called Panacea would be found there. The trouble was, if one found the location, what would they look for? What would the drug Panacea look like?

Dying billionaire Clayton Stahlman will give her five million dollars to look for the drug as well as offer his body guard Rick Hayden for protection. The body guard turned out to be a good idea. Maksim became a berserker centuries ago when the ability to blindly kill was highly valued. In the modern world this trait is less desirable. Decades ago Maksim saved the witch's life. In return, she placed a restraining spell on the beast that lives within him. Her death has broken the spell.

Maksim has lived in relative peace since the binding spell was cast. When he is consumed by the violence once again, Maksim knows something has gone wrong. He seeks out the old woman to find out why the spell has stopped working.

Along the way, Maksim infects a young stoner with his berserker blood. With the restraining spell gone, all of Maksim's concentration is centered on not killing anyone. By the time he realizes that he's infected someone, Maksim has no idea how to find the young man. If Maksim doesn't find him soon, the need for violence will overwhelm the boy and he will begin to kill.

like we are.



How to Manage a Marquess


