Food for Thought

hat is the most significant thing about the holiday season? Many will say it's the music, though, as the season wanes, some of those who so claim it will declare how tired they are of hearing the same old songs.

Could it be the decorations? I will admit I love to decorate for Christmas, but I love decorating for Halloween even more. The cackling witches, the rats, bats, and skeletons of butlers get me fired up. I haven't really analyzed it, but that may be because my birthday follows Halloween, and perhaps as a child I got all hyped up about Halloween because my (and Lani's) birthday soon followed. We've had so many birthdays since childhood that their forthcomingness should have ceased to be a factor decades ago. But the truth remains: nothing peeves me more (and I do meaning nothing) than to see Christmas decorations in the stores and for sale before Halloween.

Spiritual and religious people would claim the most important thing about the season is remembering the reason for it. I take no issue with that as long as we are tolerant of those religions and spiritualities that are different from our own. And that we do not restrict ourselves to the small span of time between November and January when it comes to celebrating our spiritualism, that we seek to do it all year around.

Is the most significant thing about the holiday season the fact that we become more altruistic and donate more? Not for me. I'm one of those people who always feels uncomfortable receiving gifts from others but who gets the greatest joy in the world from seeing someone's facial expression when I have directly or indirectly given them something they wanted. I'm that way throughout the year. I wish it were in my purview to make everyone happy all year round. I do what I can.

So, if it's not the music, the decorations, the giving and receiving of gifts, or the religiosity associated with it, what could possibly singularly represent the very best of the holiday season?

It's gotta be the food.

This guess is somewhat supported by several facts:

(1) The American eater will gain close to ten pounds in that small span of time between November 1st and January 3rd. There is no other single block of time that will yield the same results...unless it's pregnancy.

(2) Cooks come out of the woodwork to pass down (or keep going) familial recipes. Think about it. What dishes served on your Thanksgiving table go back more than a generation?

(3) The uniquely holiday foods. Or what dishes reappear that you haven't seen in eleven months that are not associated with a particular holiday? Examples of those would

include: cranberry sauce, egg nog, sweet potato pie, pumpkin pie, etc.

(4) The reappearance of diets, diet programs, exercising equipment and gym memberships. Those industries know we wolf it down during November and December, and they poise themselves to make money on the other sides of those months. Back in late September and early October, didn't you hear, "Shed those pounds in time for the holidays." Or now that the holidays are upon us, "Lose those extra, unwanted pounds by joining ______." Doing so goes hand in hand with our resolutions.

(5) Then there are the associations:

What do most people eat on Thanksgiving? Turkey. What meat is a sure bet on most tables at Christmas?

Ham.

What good luck food do we eat on New Year's Day? Black-eyed peas.

What drink do we traditionally pour on New Year's Eve? Champagne (or sparking cider, sparkling grape, or another sparkling combo.)

Thus, it would seem to me that food, by virtue of the fact that it has so many ways of proving it is overwhelmingly embedded in our culture, is the singular most significant representative of the season.

Having established that, we went back and asked some of our readers (1) how they cook something or (2) to pass on a family holiday recipe.

Now, let's talk turkeys:

(1) Do you brine your turkey before cooking it?

Read the label on the turkey before you make that decision. It is inadvisable to soak a frozen turkey because before many turkeys are frozen, they are injected with a saline (salty) solution. Brining a turkey like that would result in disaster. So



check the label to see whether it has been injected.

Seventy per cent who were asked do not brine their turkeys. Brining a turkey means soaking it in a salty solution (usually Kosher or sea salt and water) over a prolong period of time. There are lots of recipes for brining. The times for brining vary as do the spices that go into the brining solution. Pre-made brining solutions can be purchased at places like Sur la Table and William-Sonoma. Brining actually changes the molecular structure of the turkey, making it more tender. The thirty per cent who do soak, swear about it. Says Jake at Bank of the West, "Soaking a turkey in brine is done for 24 hours before it's cooked. Then the turkey is thoroughly rinsed so that it is not salty. It's the most tender, succulent and moist turkey you can do."

My turkeys are like that but my secret is aluminum foil. Betty cooks her turkey in a roaster, but she wraps it up in aluminum foil before she puts it in the roaster and covers it. When it's done, she browns it under a low (350) BROIL for about 15 minutes. She swears that the moisture stays inside.

This paragraph is out of place, but I just want everyone to know that unless you are buying a prepared ham (i.e. Honeybaked Ham or precooked from the grocery store)... An uncooked ham needs to soak in water to remove the excess salt from it.

(2) Is it stuffing or dressing AND do you put it inside the turkey or in a separate dish?

We found the name of stuffing or dressing depends on where you're from. Southerners and Midwesterners lean toward dressing. New Englanders and West coasters have stuffing. For the rest of the country, it's a toss-up.

Would you believe that the choice of whether it goes inside or outside the turkey is age related? Middle-aged to older women will stuff their turkeys. They have done so safely for years or under the supervision of an elder family cook and feel comfortable doing it today. On the other hand, younger women, many of whom do not take on the task of roasting a turkey, have been warned to the extent that they are cautious about the hazards of undercooking, the growth of salmonella and other bacteria, and will only cook their stuffing in a separate container.

(3) Gravy--with giblets or without?

Here's the other reason why it's very important to read the turkey label. It will be designated on the label whether or not the turkey contains giblets. What are giblets? They are the liver and gizzard that are usually found inside the turkey in a paper bag. The neck is usually in the cavity but is not wrapped or contained in a bag. Take it from me: there is nothing worse than assuming you have the giblets to make giblet gravy, only to find out that they were deliberately eliminated. Why does that happen? Some people do not want giblet gravy. The stores will take every opportunity presented to them to sell turkey parts separately. They make more money doing it that way.

Southerners as well as people who have gone to migration sites (where Southerners moved *en masse* for work

opportunities) like Detroit, Chicago, Pittsburg, and Cleveland want giblet gravy. It's a toss-up otherwise.

Now that we have given you what we hope are helpful hints, here are some heirloom recipes you may want to try, some of which go back to the old countries:

Let's start off with a holiday drink:

Homemade Brandy Egg-nog submitted by Victoria F. of New Jersey—serves about 10



Ingredients:

5 eggs, separated 1 quart of half and half 3 tablespoons of sugar 1 ounce of rum 1/2 fifth of brandy Nutmeg

Beat egg whites until stiff. Set aside. Mix egg yolks with sugar in a large mixing bowl Add brandy and rum Slowly add half and half, Fold in egg whites Chill Sprinkle with nutmeg

MKS: It's not a horrible thing, but people have no clue how much work

AdC: What is your favorite thing about being an author?

MKS: There are so many great things about being an author. I do like the opportunity to meet so many great people. I enjoy working with my husband and then there's cover art!

AdC: *How many books do you currently have out on the market and what genres do they fall into?*

MKS: This is definitely my question! M K Scott (cozy mysteries)-Three out and another in the proofing stage; Rayna Noire (magical realism)-Five; Morgan K Wyatt (romance/romantic suspense)-Seven;



Morgan Kay (flirty contemporary romance)- Eight.

AdC: *What can we expect from you next?*

MKS: *Murder Mansion* audiobook will be out in November;

Christmas Calamity by M K Scott (cozy mystery) will be out late November; and *Dangerous Regrets* by Morgan Kay (contemporary) will be out in January 2017.

Candied Yams Yours truly (and you can tell I don't measure)—serves about six

Ingredients:

2-3 large sweet potatoes or yams (I mix them)
1 1/2 cups of water
3/4 cup of brown sugar
Half stick of butter (I don't use margarine)
Nutmeg (1 tsp)
Cinnamon (1 tsp)
Marshmallows (optional)

Peel yams and cut quarters or eighths. Put them in a pan and cook until they are tender.

Add sugar, nutmeg and cinnamon.

Cook until most of the liquid is gone, stirring to prevent yams from sticking to the pot.

Adjust the ingredients to your taste--more sugar if you need it, more spice, more butter.

Add marshmallows on the top if you are so inclined, cooking

Brie En Croute

(There are many variants of this, *Epicurious,* for one, has several suggestions.)

I get a big glass pie pan and construct it in the middle leaving plenty of space on all sides for crackers.

Ingredients:

1 wedge of Brie. (4-6 oz) 1 box of puff pastry Craisins (unsweetened if handy) Marmalade Walnuts or almonds An egg Some crackers

Thaw at least one of the sheets.

Set the brie (I never rind it) in the middle.

Shloop some marmalade, craisins, and nuts down on top of the brie.

If I think I can close it all by folding the one sheet up and tying it with some butcher's string, I do. But this is goopy stuff, and if you think you need two sheets, drop the second one down on the top and kind of fold the edges like a wonton and hope for the best. (Stitching it with butcher's string does NOT work.) Put a little egg/water eggwash on the top and bake it at 350 for 30 minutes or until golden and lovely.

Ingredients: 1 pound pork sausage ¹/₂ pound uncooked rice 1 whole cabbage Salt and Pepper

Directions:

To soften cabbage, put in a large pan of hot boiling water. Let sit in water for ten minutes until leaves start to soften enough to peel away from the head.

Mix together sausage, rice, salt and pepper.

Take a leaf off of the cabbage head and lay down, place a tablespoon or more full of the mixture into the leaf. Starting at the bottom of the leaf, roll and fold in sides and then roll completely up.

Place all rolls in a dutch oven, fill with water and boil for 2-2 $^{1\!/}_{2}$ hours.

I find that placing them in a covered casserole dish and baking at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours works just as well.

Aunt NiNi's Sweet Bacon Snacks

Ingredients:

Package of Club Crackers, separated by one rectangular cracker.

1 teaspoon full of brown sugar

1 Package of bacon thin slices.

Directions:

Take a cracker, put a teaspoonful of brown sugar on it, then wrap the cracker in bacon. Bake in oven at 350 degrees until bacon has browned or cooked to your liking.

Can also be done in a savory/spicy version using taco sauce mixed up and put on cracker or a small slice of jalapeno. Use your imagination.

Makes 2 dozen.

Spotlight Interview







Author of more than 45 novels, Deborah Camp lives in Oklahoma. Her books have been published by Amazon, Jove, New American Library, Harlequin, Silhouette, and Avon. Lover of the West and the people who tried to tame it, Ms. Camp likes to write about strong, independent women and the men who are their equals. Her books have been re-issued on Amazon for Kindle Direct and have attracted tens of thousands of new fans.

AdC: When did you start writing and why?

DC: War is hell, right? We all know that, but nobody knows it better than the people who experience it first-hand. Back in the old days before psychiatrists and psychologists understood post-traumatic stress and how to deal with it, people were left to their own devices. Some ended their lives, others were placed in mental institutions, but most had to struggle through their symptoms alone and misunderstood. Even today the stigma of PTSD burdens many of its victims.

AdC: Tell us about your new book or series.

DC: In my novel, *Solitary Horseman*, I shine a light on a few of these earlier victims. Set in Texas a few years after the Civil War, the book features Callum Latimer, who is going through the motions of living without feeling any of its joy or satisfaction. His brothers were killed in the war and the heartbreak of that took his mother, as well. He returned home to ghosts of what he once held dear and a father who is barely able to get around, having suffered a riding accident. Into his world steps a courageous, kind, and lovely Banner Payne. He's known of her his whole life, but he doesn't know her. After they strike a deal that will help them keep their ranches



out of the hands of greedy bankers and carpetbaggers, Callum's eyes – and heart – are opened by the strong and lovely young woman.

Banner lives with Hollis, her only surviving brother. Hollis returned from the war a shadow of his former self. He's haunted by horrific memories of the war and can find little solace in the world around him.

Bookended by these two broken men, Banner clings to the belief that what doesn't kill you makes you stronger. While she tries to keep her brother's flickering life flame alive, she ignites a passion in Callum that sweeps through her, as well. Set in the backdrop of a turbulent time in American history, *Solitary Horseman* is a testament to the courage of men and the resilience of women.



AdC: What is your favorite thing about being an author? DC: One of my favorite things about writing is that I can take detours and explore facets of history and character studies. While the Civil War is highly dramatic and chock full of stories, the decade after it is also fascinating and frightening. The South didn't roll over and die. Southerners were incensed about losing the war and the multitude of changes that took place. The KKK sprang up along with other vigilante groups. Hatred mushroomed and law and order became hit and miss.

I think that most people resist change and that gets us into sticky situations. I know that I dread any kind of big upheaval. Little changes can be fun, but big ones are usually highly stressful! Like relocating or allowing a new person into your life. I like to have a plan and follow it. Of course, some of it goes awry because no one can control life.

I write the same way. I plan or outline a book and then follow that plan to completion. I guess it works because I've written more than 45 novels.

AdC: *What can we expect from you next?*

DC: I've already outlined my next historical romance, but right now I'm writing #4 in my "Mind's Eye" series. "Mind's Eye" features two psychics - Trudy Tucker and Levi Wolfe - who join forces to identify serial killers, murderers, and kidnappers. Trudy can get into the perpetrator's mind and see what he sees. Levi can commune with the deceased victims. Trudy and Levi have also become lovers and are engaged to be married now. While each case is solved in each book, the relationship between Trudy and Levi keeps evolving. In the one I'm writing now, which should be released on Amazon in the spring, Levi and Trudy are in New Orleans working on a serial killer case. I'm really having fun with it and scaring myself! These books are a real departure from my historical romances and not just because they're contemporary. The "Mind's Eye" series is gritty and sexy (bordering on erotic). My historical romances are sexy, but much more subdued. And while I have danger in my historical romances, I go way beyond that in the "Mind's Eye" series.
