Thank you for taking the time to visit with us. Here are some burning questions from authors and readers looking for a good, honest, and reliable publisher.

AdC: When did you know you wanted to help authors with their dreams of becoming a published author and how long have you been in the publishing business?

C.P.: I've been in the publishing business about 14 years. My mom is also an author, and we both started out traditionally published. I moved to self-publishing ahead of her, so I'd already made all the mistakes before she decided to try it. Helping her publish her books was my first step into helping other authors. It was never an intentional plan. I just found myself taking on

more and more authors as I met people who fit.

AdC: What type of books do you publish?

C.P.: Everything from children's books to poetry to hardcore erotica. You can get an idea of what we do from the excerpts cited with each book cover on the next page:

AdC: What do you look for and expect from an author?


C.P.: I look for people who can't quit. Not people who I think won't, but people who can't. Writing is a hard career path. I know some people make it look easy, but it's not. People give up this career all the time, because it's a real struggle. If you think you can quit, you should. If you know you can't, then you're in the right business.

AdC: How do you market your

C.P.: Advertising on Twitter, Facebook, Tumblr, Instagram, blogs, and giveaways. The list goes on and on, but I also expect authors to do their part. If you're not willing to sell yourself, then no one else can help you.

AdC: Are there any author fees that need to be paid upfront? Or future fees? For example, do you give author discounts for books ordered for book signings, etc. or do they have to pay full price for the books?

C.P.: There's a fee to advertise on the homepage of Punk & Sissy Publications. Additionally, if an author wants to join a giveaway, they have to contribute toward the prize, and help spread the word. Otherwise, money should always flow toward the author. If a company asks you for money, run.

Self-Publishing Doesn't Have to be a Disaster

have been published with a standard/traditional publishing house, a vanity-press, self-published-literally from writing to binding, and self-publishing with Amazon.

I've made mistakes and will most likely continue to make mistakes. Hopefully, I've learned enough and won't make too many more.

We'll start with the fact that you've written a book or even a couple of books.

The book needs to be formatted properly. Now, we're talking about fiction. Non-fiction is handled differently and isn't usually formatted until after the book is edited for multiple reasons. (References, indexing, etc.)

Pick up a book by a large publishing company. Look at some hard copies, some e-books, some trade paperbacks, and some mass market books.

That's what you want to do.

Why? Because they've spent a lot of money researching and re-adjusting to make sure it's formatted to please and entice the reader.

You want to make the reader happy, too. You want to do what is most convenient for them. You want the reader to like your book. You've heard it before. The customer's always right. (Except for the trolls...they don't count.)

If you don't know how to format a manuscript to look like it's been professionally done, you need to pay someone to do it.

> ext you want an editor, a good editor. Please don't shake your head and say you don't need one, or don't want one. Even if you're awesome, they'll still find things you've missed.

Alas, even editors aren't perfect and miss mistakes. It happens. When it does and someone has been kind enough to point it out, fix it ASAP.



It must grab their interest. It needs to make them want to buy, or "look inside" and read the chapter preview. This is where so many self-published authors lose their potential readers. You're awful with writing book descriptions. Do you find it hard to do? I understand. It's an art form. This is what you need to do. I've suggested this to you before, and I'm going to suggest it again.

Go to the first page of the top twenty of the genre you're publishing at Amazon or Barnes and Noble. Read what and how their descriptions are written. Did you notice the first line is in **bold**? Or a different color? You need to do that. Read how they've written the descriptions and take notes of the wording, adjectives, and adverbs they're using. You need to do that, just like that.

Do you see the "look inside"?

You need to do that.


When the book is out, create an author page with Amazon, Goodreads, and anyplace else that will let you. If you publish through Amazon, that author page is free. Goodreads, free.

Now that's what we like!

LIAR, LIAR, PANTS (what pants?) ON FIRE



There is a recognized paradox in online dating (Books have been written about it!). Because it is not face to face, there is a sense of disconnect and anonymity. It just doesn't seem quite as "real" as what is referred to as "organic" dating. This paradox results in two behaviors.

The first is euphemistically referred to as more "honest and open expression." Pardon me while I gag on the PC interpretation! Ladies, here's the stripped down truth: Online daters—by virtue of online dating's anonymity and virtual reality-will engage in behavior they would *never* think to try with a person they have actually met. Think cock shots and dick pics to start. (And yes, they are frequent.) A picture may be worth a thousand words, but words, too, have their own power. I haven't decided if that's better or worse than the 50+ year-old woman using her 30-something-year-old daughter's . . .)

Spotlight Interview



This month the spotlight is on... Peggy Jaeger

Peggy Jaeger is a contemporary romance writer who writes about strong women, the families who support them, and the men who can't live without them.

Family and food play huge roles in Peggy's stories because she believes there is nothing that holds a family structure together like sharing a meal...or two...or ten. Dotted with humor and characters that are as real as they are loving, Peggy brings all topics of daily life into her stories: life, death, sibling rivalry, illness and the desire for everyone to find their own happily ever after.

AdC: When did you start writing?

P.J.: I've always been a journal-er, what most people call a diarist, ever since I was a kid. And I wrote stories in my journals all the time about girls who weren't like me, who led amazing lives, and had adventures. I still write in my diary every day, but now I actually get to publish the fiction stories!

AdC: What have you learned about writing since you started?

P.J.: That it's my oxygen. My drug of choice. The thing I need to do every day in order to feel total joy and remain happy.

AdC: Tell us about your new book or series.

P.J.: *Can't Stand the Heat* is the third book in my "Will Cook for Love" series from Lyrical Shine. CSTH tells Stacy Peter's story. She's a television producer who's developed a show she thinks will be perfect for her network. Before the programming chief will give her the green light for the show though, he asks her to do one more programming favor for him and executive produce an upcoming cooking competition called Beef Battles for the network. She'll need to deal with famed director Dominick Stamp who is no fan of producers, or anyone else who interferes with his directing style. Dominick and Stacy are about as opposite as opposite can get in every



way – physically, emotionally, the way they treat the staff, you name it. But you know what they say about opposites and attraction!

AdC: What is your idea of a perfect writing day?

P.J.: Basically, I have the perfect writing day everyday! I write for 3-4 hours in the morning, then go to the gym and do all the adult stuff I need to do like laundry, grocery shop, etc. Then after lunch I write for another 4-5 hours until my hubby comes home from work. I cook dinner, and then we relax for the rest of the evening. Yup, that's my life. Don't hate me!

AdC: *How/where do you get your* plot ideas?

P.J.: I am a world-class people watcher. And eavesdropper. All my plots start out with the characters. I see a person in a restaurant, or the bank, or even in line at the movies, and I start to imagine their backstory. My first character is usually my heroine, so I give her a life, a career, and a problem. Then I think of a hero who will be integral in either resolving her problem or adding to it. From that, a plot develops.

AdC: What is the most difficult thing about creating and developing characters?

P.J.: Making them real to the reader. I've read books where there is no way on God's green earth the main character could survive in the real world. Either too stupid, too arrogant, or just too plain dumb to be real. I try – and I try hard – to make my characters seem like you'd meet them as neighbors, or at work, or even standing behind you in line at the grocery store. I give them faults, real emotions, issues. See? Real people! When I get it right, and a reader tells me that they could see, hear, and relate to my characters, I do a happy dance, because that's the highest praise you can give me.

AdC: What is your favorite thing about being an author?

P.J.: Knowing I touched a reader's life or made their day when they read something I wrote.

AdC: *How many books do you* currently have out on the market and what genres do they fall into?

P.J.: With Can't Stand the Heat it'll be eleven and they all fall into the contemporary romance genre. If there was a genre called small town, family oriented, humorous contemporary, that's where my books would fit.

D.P What was the first cover you appeared on and how did this come about?

K.M. The first book cover I was on was actually the back cover of *Letting Love Find Me* ("Damaged Hearts Book 3") by Katharina LeBoeuf. I had just started book cover modeling when I got a message from B.T. Urruela who runs Wicked Warrior Photography. He needed to find a young brunette for a custom shoot for the cover and asked if I would be interested. I was beyond excited and honored to work with BT, Katharina and the other cover model on the cover, Peyton Anthony.

D. P. If you could do a photo shoot anywhere in the


world for a cover, where would you most want to go? What sort of shoot would it be?

K.M. I would LOVE to do a shoot in Scotland. I love the countryside and historical feel of the little towns in the Highlands. I would want the shoot to be very romantic with a sweet contemporary feel.

D.P: Beyond romance novel cover shots, what other projects or jobs keep you busy?

K.M. I am actually a bestselling romance author. I write contemporary, new adult, and erotic romances that span from military, rock star, sports, motorcycle club, romantic comedy and everything in between. That is how I found out about book cover modeling, and I started making friends





with models and photographers along the way at book events. When Christopher John of CJC Photography asked if I would be interested in shooting with him in Tampa, since we were both locals at the time, I jumped on the opportunity and realized that I absolutely love the modeling side of the industry.

D.P. What's one question you wish an interviewer would ask you? (Then please answer it.)

K.M. How many stories do you have floating around in your head? – the answer is WAY TOO MANY! I am writing three books right now and have 10 more begging to be written this year alone. This actually comes into play in my modeling too... As I write new characters, I get ideas for new shoots. It's a pretty fun process when I get to be creative in my writing and modeling careers simultaneously.

D.P. If you wrote a book, what would it be about?

K.M. I guess this is kind of a trick question for me, since I have already

published over twenty books in my writing career. But, one type of book that I would love to write that I have not yet is fantasy. I would love to write about a magical realm full of dragons and everything. Hopefully, someday, sooner than later, it'll happen.

D.P. This question is almost always asked in interviews because your fitness level is beyond the average persons. What is your exercise routine, and what sort of nutrition plan do you follow to achieve and maintain your level of fitness?


K.M. This is an interesting question for me because I am in no way a fitness model. I do stick to a healthier eating routine but with my jampacked writing schedule I do not get to the gym nearly as often as I would like to.

D.P. If you could share three simple fitness tips the average romance reader could do every day to stay healthy, what would they be?

K.M. I always tell people to not put crazy restrictions on themselves. Something that most people do not know about me is that right after college my doctor told me that I needed to get my weight under control. I had been working in restaurants and bars for years (I went to the University of Central Florida for Restaurant and Food Service Management) and fell victim to terrible eating habits and grueling work schedules. I tried crash dieting, and nothing seemed to really work. Once I started shifting to eating healthier but not cutting

my favorites, like pizza and pasta, out of my diet completely and regularly going to the gym, I was able to lose the forty pounds that I needed to. I have kept with that mindset for the last six years or so and it has been working for me.

D.P. It's your birthday dinner and the calories don't count. What's on the menu and what are you drinking?

K.M. A giant bowl of spaghetti and meatballs with a really good Malbec. It's my favorite meal, hands down.

D.P. Describe the perfect romantic evening:

K.M. I am such a chill person... So honestly, a perfect romantic evening for me usually consists of good beer, live music, and pizza.

D.P. Please share one unusual fact about you or your life:

K.M. One unusual fact about my life if that I am actually extremely dyslexic. Most people don't believe me since I am an author, but it's true. I actually couldn't even read on my own until I was in the fifth grade. I remember the day that I

read an entire paragraph on my own for the first time. I was so shocked and burst into tears sitting on the couch with my mother while we were working on my homework together. Also, I have to give my editor a lot of credit because she definitely has her work cut out for her whenever she is working on my manuscripts. But, this is just one example of how you can overcome even the hardest of limitations to follow your dreams and see them turn into reality.

Spotlight Interview



This issue the second Spotlight Interview is on ... **Rachel Brimble**

Rachel lives in the famous Georgian city of Bath, England, with her husband of 20 years and their two daughters. She currently has eight books with Harlequin Superromance (Templeton Cove Stories), four Victorian romances with eKensington and has just signed a new four-book contract with Aria. AdC: When did vou start writing?

R.B. I've written stories since I was around nine or ten, but I started getting down to the serious business of having a novel published in 2005. I haven't looked back since!

AdC: What have you learned about writing since you started?

R.B. That it's a business! It is no longer enough just to write the best book you can – you have to be a writer, a publicist, an accountant and a relatable human being. Authors are expected to multi-task by publishers and readers alike. Fortunately, I enjoy all aspects of the business...even if I have very little time for anything else

AdC: Tell us about your new book or series.

R.B. A Stranger in The Cove is the final book in my popular "Templeton Cove" series (Harlequin). Although this is the last book, this novel and all the others, can be read standalone so readers can dip in and out as they please. The series is a mix of mainstream romance and romantic suspense stories set in the fictional UK seaside town of Templeton Cove. The series is very close to my heart.

AdC: What is your idea of a perfect writing day?

R.B. I'm at the computer by 9 am after a half an hour read in bed, then I work on promotion for an hour or so before I dive into the writing. I'd work for another hour or so and then walk the dog. Once back, I'd continue writing until lunch time – short half an hour break and then back to work until 5:30 P.M.

No interruptions, no kids screaming at me, no laundry that needs folding

AdC: *How/where do you get your plot ideas?*

R.B. Ideas are everywhere! They can be found in newspapers, on TV, people's conversations, history... everywhere. The trick is to find an idea and think 'what if?' or 'how can I make this story brand new?' Obtaining the ideas isn't the challenge with writing. The challenge is making that initial idea stretch to 80,000 words plus!



AdC: What is the most difficult thing about creating and developing characters?

R.B. For me, it's really nailing down their goals, motivations **R.B.** Give yourself permission to write a crappy first draft and conflicts – I start every book thinking I have it clear - this wisdom was given to me about 7 years ago and my in my mind and dive into the writing. Then, every time, output quadrupled overnight. A full page can be edited. A I hit a wall around the 40,000 word mark when I realize blank page can't. Simple! something about the character I didn't know and have to go back to make sure I include it and the rest of the story flows Please give us the following contact information: seamlessly around the new discovery. AdC: What is your favorite thing about being an author? **R.B.** That I get to do what I love every day – I haven't had that Monday morning feeling for over 12 years and I'm eternally grateful.


AdC: How many books do you currently have out on the market and what genres do they fall into?

He flitted his focus to the band once more. "I'm looking for work."


She frowned. "In Templeton?"



Researching this article was a delight, but it could also be depressing when comparing one's own accomplishments with theirs. I was astounded by the sheer numbers of inventions by women. I was also so impressed with the brilliance of some women, the determination and persistence of many. There are several things that, though not acknowledged, were apparent from the beginning:

1. Many of the things women invented were done to make their tasks and ultimately their lives easier. Liquid Paper was a prime example-developed by a typist who was tired of having to re-type because of an error. (I can definitely relate.)

2. Men often took credit for what women did. Disposable diapers were invented by Marion Donovan, a woman, in the 1940's. Discouraged by businessmen in the industry, she sold her disposable diapers herself. Several years later Pampers, Loves, disposable diapers, were introduced via a Proctor and Gamble platform by men in the 60's. It is a multi-billion dollar industry for which she received nothing.

This practice was particularly prevalent for African-American women (and there were scores of them). As slaves, they had no rights and owned nothing. If they created something, their masters not only got the credit, but they got the money as well. Sarah Boone (1832-1904) invented the ironing board to make it easier to press sleeves. Born a slave, she created this invention to make it easier to do her work, but as a slave, she was not entitled to its profits.

3. How young some of these women were when they started their pursuits.

4. While some of these inventions have been around, many of them came about during my life time which surprised me. That means that women are still at it. Let us hope that future women inventors will be acknowledged, praised, rewarded financially and set forth as examples of heroines.
